### Civil War Telegraph Revenue Stamps: 1862-1871

As funding for the Union war efforts, a federal tax program was passed by the House and approved by the Senate in June of 1862. Most types of transactions were taxed by way of one of over 100 different first issue revenue stamps produced. There were two telegraph stamps of which one must be applied to each telegraph/telegram message sent. The one cent for messages costing less than twenty cents for the first ten words and a three cent stamp for those over twenty cents.

### American Rapid Telegraph Company: 1879-1891

The American Rapid Telegraph Company began operating in 1879 in New York. The company had lines reaching into Massachusetts and Ohio. Unable to pay its bills, the company was sold to a purchasing committee in 1891. It wasn't until June 25th 1894 that the committee deeded the properties and franchise to the Western Union Telegraph Company.

#### **Telegram Stamps: 1881**

Stamps inscribed "Telegram" were sold to the general public for prepayment of messages, which they would then drop in collection boxes. They were issued in sheets of 100, perforated 12 without straight edges on any sheet margin. Engraved by the American Bank Note Company

#### **Telegram Stamps: Remainders**

After bankrupcy, all stamp stock was sold to a stamp dealer in New York.

All stamps were punch cancelled with a 2.25 mm hole. This punch cancel should not be confused with a 3.6 mm filing hole punch often seen on used stamps.


