Before the undersigned justice of the peace in and for Adams County after said personally came Henry Clutz and Joseph Walker, Citizens of said County and who I certify are credible and reputable witnesses who being duly sworn say that they live near to the farm of John Waugh, six miles south of Gettysburg, and that after the battles at Gettysburg in July last a part of the 11th Army Corps encamped on said farm and made use of the fence rails for fuel and the grass and growing Rye was mowed down and pastured by said Army for their horses. and then deponents say that they have examined said farm for the purpose of ascertaining the amount and value of the property so taken and find that 1248 Rails have been taken from the fences and that they were worth \$7.00 per 100. also that Eight Acres of grass was mowed and taken for forage and pastured by the Horses of said Army and that this grass was equal to Seven (7) Tons of Hay and was worth \$14 - per Ton also that a field of Rye was partly cut down and that the crop was equal to 40 Bushels of Rye worth \$1.00 per bushel.

day of July last a part of the 11th Army
Corps encamped on the farm of John
Wright, six miles south of Gettysburg
on their march south, that said farm
was occupied by Daniel Hesper
who had a quantity of Hay and Stems
in his Barn, and that at least
Fifty (5) tons of Hay and Forty (40)
Bundles of long Stems were taken by
said Army and Carried from the
Barn of said Hesper for forage for
their animals. and that no
computation nor any vouchers
were obtained for the same
